OME-RESA's Food Program Rebates School Districts Over \$29,000

Through various rebate incentives with GFS, OME-RESA has rebated participating Cooperative Members over \$29,000. This amount is based on purchases during the 2014-2015 school year. The rebate consists of 0.5% rebate on eligible purchases from the Food Program as well as an additional 1% for those members participating in GFS' Prime Vendor Program. OME-RESA will rebate a total of \$29,098.35. Districts can save additional dollars by enrolling in GFS' Quick Pay Incentive. If you'd like to enroll in GFS's Prime Vendor Program or Quick Pay Incentive next school year, please contact your local GFS sales representative or Cooperative Services.

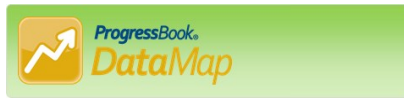

DataMap Presentation

Mark your calendars for June 1st! Software Answers will be conducting a DataMap presentation at our Steubenville training center. If your district is interested in learning more about DataMap, you will want to attend this presentation. The presentation is open to Principals, Coordinators, or anyone else in the district that would like to attend.

New Feature

With the recent release of 15.3, if you are the owner of a Student Objective (SLO), you can now mark students as excluded from the objective if they have withdrawn or have not met the attendance requirement. You can also re-include any excluded students who re-enroll in the class or those that you accidentally excluded. If you exclude students from a Student Objective, the Student Objective rating calculation does not include those students' data in the calculation.



Activity Details

A new screen, Activity Details, replaced the previous Activity Builder screen in the recent 15.3 release. You can access this new screen by clicking an activity in My Library and then selecting Edit/Schedule from the Actions menu. This new screen has three tabs related to the activity in context: Settings, Questions and Results.

Auto-Grade

Auto-grading now occurs by default. There is a Preview before post option that allows the teacher to review and change any auto-scored marks before they are posted to GradeBook.

Google Docs

On any screen where you are prompted to upload a file, you can now connect to Google Drive and select a file from your account. You can set it as a live link to the document, or you can make it available for students to download.

New Page Added

A new Resources link has been added to the navigation menu. If a teacher has published resources for an activity, students can access them from the new Resources screen.

Roster Verification

Roster Verification is underway with the primary purpose of Roster Verification to provide teacher-verified roster data that will be used to develop EVASS value-added reports. These reports will be included in the electronic Teacher and Principal Evaluation System (eTEPS).

The Teacher Roster Verification Period ends on May 17th. Principals should monitor teacher completion and review submitted classes and approve them.

The Principal Approval Period runs from May 18th thru June 3rd. During this timeframe, principals should perform a final review of classes, reviewing staff instructional responsibilities and alerts.

Adobe Connect

A goal of the fiscal department was to learn Adobe Connect and post mini trainings on our website. We had a recording session and posted a few beginner level topics for some of the most commonly used processes. The trainings can be found on the OME-RESA website. RAM & Kiosk



Additional districts have been set up on RAM and Kiosk in the past month. Requisition Approval Manager (RAM) is a workflow system for approving requisitions. Requisitions from USAS are loaded into RAM on an hourly basis. A workflow of approvers can then be applied to the requisition. Once a requisition is approved by the final approver, the accounts payable clerk is notified via email so the requisition can be converted into a purchase order.

FISCAL SERVICES UPDATE—CONTINUED



The employee Kiosk provides on-demand access for employees to manage leaves, view pay slips, and access personal information. Additionally, there are other modules within the Kiosk that a district can choose to utilize such as Individual Professional Development Plan (IPDP). USAS/USPS Redesign

There were 5 districts that volunteered to test the redesign. Volunteers were Claymont, ECOESC, Franklin, Quaker Digital Academy, OVESC, and OME-RESA. They were asked to test data using their live files. Bugs and what's missing were reported to the SSDT. Since the initial test, 19 additional districts have attended orientations to the redesign. There were 6 full day sessions in March/April, 3 for USAS, and 3 for USPS. Kudos to Missy Sutherland and Valerie Keough for working so hard to load the districts' live date into the redesign software.

Here are a few items that can be checked now to make June close out a little easier:

- Run the STRS Advance and balance the FYTD totals to the checks written to STRS for the FY16 earnings
- Run W2PROC , look for fatals and balance the first 2 quarters
- Run VALACT and look for invalid accounts. Backup and run ACTCHG if needed.

UPDATE: FREE READING RESOURCES IN JEOPARDY FOR 2016-17!

Our students' free access to BookFlix and Stora is in jeopardy for 2016-17 because INFOhio's funding was cut by 42% in the state budget process. This school year, the Ohio Department of Education had discretionary funding that allowed INFOhio to continue to offer BookFlix and Stora, but that funding will be unavailable for the next school year. Unless funding is restored, students will lose access to BookFlix and Stora. If your students depend on them, please take five minutes to contact your state senator and representative. Let them know your students depend on these digital tools to improve their reading skills. Please ask them to restore INFOhio's funding in the Midyear Budget Review.

2. New Staff hired for 2016/2017 – send names to Dave
3. Retired/moved staff for 2015/2016 – send names to Dave
4. Clean up INACTIVE Patrons
 - Run PAT>List Users report
 - Specify <7/1/2016 in the Privilege exp.date: (located under the User Selection tab
 - This report will also help you clean up any INACTIVE students with FINES/FEES.
5. Clean up any Titles WITHOUT copies
 - From the ALL TITLES report tab, select the “List Titles with No Copies”
 - Under the Call Number Selection tab – select your Library
 - Under the Sorting Tab – sort by call number so that those titles with XX Call numbers will be near the end of the report.
 - **REMEMBER** – check the **FORMAT** report option prior to **VIEWING/PRINTING** report
 - Remove any duplicate titles that you might have already catalogued...this would indicate just a duplicate SmartPort capture
 - Complete any titles that need further processing – Add barcode, call number, etc.

The Techie Tipster: When in doubt . . . DELETE!

You all get them, suspicious looking emails from people you don't know and some from those you do know.

Why? Most likely someone has hacked an email account or possibly purchased a third party list with the hope of gaining your personal information such as bank accounts or social security numbers.

Most of these emails contain an attachment or a link. Once you click on that attachment or link, the hacker will have access to your email and everything in it. Plus they can send out mass emails to everyone on your contact list.

Worse, a virus or spyware could be automatically downloaded onto your computer, allowing the hackers access to everything on your computer, not just your email.

So what do you do?

When you receive a suspicious email from a known sender, like a friend, and it looks like their email account has been hacked, DELETE it.

Do not reply to it telling them their email has been hacked because now the hacker will have your email information. Call them if you want to let them know.

Do not send it to your spam folder either because, once your friend gets their email password changed, you don't want future emails from that friend to wind up in your spam folder. So don't click on any links. Just delete the email.

If you receive a suspicious email from someone you don't know, do NOT open it. Immediately send it to your spam folder, sometimes referred to as your junk folder.

Most email providers have security measures in place to catch suspicious emails so they will automatically forward them to your spam.

If it doesn't, you'll need to move the suspicious email from your inbox to your spam folder, without opening it, so future emails from that sender will go directly to spam.

TECHNICAL SERVICES UPDATE - CONTINUED

Occasionally a wanted email ends up in your spam folder. Tread carefully before opening any emails in your spam and certainly NEVER open any links or attachments. It's almost guaranteed to be either a phishing scam or contain a virus. Only open attachments when, first, you know the sender and, second, you were expecting the attachment.

If the email in your spam folder looks to be from someone you know, the email provider will usually allow you to look at it safely before opening the entire email. Most likely the reason the email ended up in your spam folder is that friend's account was hacked. It's a good idea to empty your spam folder weekly.

If your email account has been compromised, change your password immediately. Once the password is changed, the hackers will no longer have access to your account. Of course, they can hack it again, so keep your passwords strong and change them often.

Also check your bank, credit card and social media accounts to make sure they have not been hacked as well.

Chain emails should never be opened. If you accidentally open one, delete it immediately.

It might be tempting to forward a chain email to someone, especially if it contains something funny or an amusing image. But most likely that chain email started with a hacker hoping to get your attention.

Instead of bothering your friends with an unwanted email, delete it. If you receive a chain email from someone you know, delete it. Just because the chain email came from a known sender doesn't it is safe to open. It can still be harmful if they did not originate the email.

If you receive a suspicious email from a company that you already know and trust, do not reply. Instead, report the email to them directly on their website. There has been a lot of hacking in the past year with large online companies, so most of them have a place on their website where you can report fraudulent information. It may seem unnecessary, but it helps keep their online security safe and, in turn, keeps your account safe.

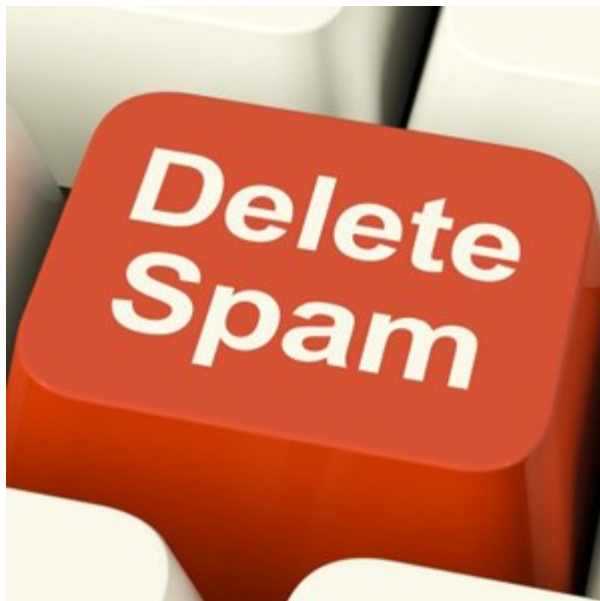
Reminders:

- There is no one in India or Brazil or anywhere else who is stranded because their wallet was stolen and now they desperately need your help. Spam that email immediately.
- No one from the IRS will send you an email. They correspond strictly by mail. If you get an email or a call claiming they are from the IRS, send it to your spam, then call and report the incident to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration at 800-366-4484.

- You have not won a contest or a raffle or anything else. Send that email to your spam folder; then empty that folder immediately.
- No one but you needs your passwords for anything. If you don't know them and they are asking for your password, they are scammers.
- Be careful when using your email on any public WiFi. If you believe you've been hacked, change your password as soon as you're back on your home WiFi.
- If a company you do business with has had their accounts hacked, immediately change your password with that company. Don't wait for them to protect your account.
- Last, don't forget to update your anti-virus software on your computer or download updates on your phone or tablet. The reason for these updates is often to make sure your devices are protected from the latest scams and hackers.

Remember, when it comes to your email safety, when in doubt . . . DELETE!
