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# ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATE

## **District Disaster Recovery Plan Trainings**

OME-RESA will present two opportunities for district personnel to attend training geared towards developing/maintaining a school district disaster recovery plan. The trainings will be held on Tuesday, December 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Quaker Dome in New Philadelphia and Tuesday, December 9<sup>th</sup> at the Ohio Valley ESC office in Cambridge. This training is best accomplished by bringing a team of district personnel (3 or 4 at most). We suggest administration personnel (Superintendent/Treasurer/Asst. Superintendent) and technical staff (Technology Coordinator and Assistants) both attend as input and plan development are crucial to both areas.

The training will include how to create and plan, AND if you already have your plan created, there will be time to review it for changes and updates that should take place on a regular basis.

## PreK-12 Notification—What's New?

TRZ is now using the Vendorlink API to integrate Student Information data and the PreK-12 data. There are many advantages to this new method of integration; however it does effect where and what data is pulled. Listed below are the notable changes with the integration and where data is now being pulled from:

#### **Student Accounts**

- \* **Student Number** The number that is located on the student profile screen is the number that will be pulled into the student account.
- \* **NOTE** The student account number is only called when a call is placed to a grade level list or a custom list that includes the student accounts.

# <u>PreK-12 Notification—What's New? - (continued)</u>

#### **Parent Accounts**

- \* Parent (primary) Number The numbers are now pulled from the primary contact for a student.
- \* Other Parent Numbers In addition to the primary number for the primary contact, any number listed as an Alt #, Cell, Mother's Cell or Father's Cell will be automatically added to the numbers in the parent account.
- \* Email Address If there is an email address in the primary contact record, this will be automatically loaded.
- \* NOTE If your school uses the Progressbook Parent Portal and updates their information there, it should flow down the PreK-12 notification system the next time the Vendorlink API processes.
- \* **NOTE** Parent numbers are called when a call is placed to the parent, parent emergency, all emergency list or a custom list that includes parents.

#### Here is the detailed explanation of how these number come over:

In the SI Database, each phone number in the Primary contact field is assigned an identifier. These identifiers are:

- · 0096 Home phone
- 0350 Alternate Number
- · 0351 Cell
- 0353 Mother's Cell
- · 0354 Father's Cell



We originally thought that the order of the phone number in the Primary contact would determine the way the API provides the information, making the first number the primary number. We have now found out that this is not true. In researching the API call we found that the numbers are provided in numeric order by the identifier, meaning that if a home phone is present, it will always be the primary number that comes over with the API.

## ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATE - CONTINUED

## PreK-12 Notification—What's New? - (continued)

#### **Account Management**

- \* **Deleted Students** If a student ID is not pulled from the API, the student is removed automatically from the school in the PreK-12.
- \* School Grade Changes If a school adds or removes a grade, it will automatically sync up with the system. Anyone in the removed grade will be removed from the system, and any new grades will have their students added. This will make the changes automatic.
- \* Staff Syncs If a staff member is entered manually, the system won't touch that record through the automated process. If a staff member has been pulled from the API it will be managed through the automated process. If a staff member that was pulled from the API is no longer in the data set, it will automatically be removed. Members manually entered must manually be removed.



#### StudentInformation

At the start of this school year, users of the StudentInformation software experienced several new enhancements. The masthead has a very different look and navigational changes were made streamlining options when searching for data.

A new Discipline Module was introduced providing the user with a much more effective way of capturing data surrounding any reported discipline incident. Users may enter as much data as they choose regarding all parties involved in an incident. Features were added for districts to allow teachers to initiate discipline incidents from their gradebook. This use of this feature is up to the discretion of the district.

StudentInformation trainings were conducted in August to assist users in becoming familiar with the changes in navigation of the software. Trainings were also conducted regionally on the new discipline module.

Report Card Processing and GPA training sessions were conducted in October. These sessions are conducted annually, but this year the GPA section was added to the training in an effort to provide users with a better understanding of the GPA processing in the application software.

#### **DataMap**

You can now use DataMap to manage your Student Learning Objectives (SLOs) to measure your students' growth from start to finish through a review process. Documentation has been added into the User Guide that is available on the OME-RESA website under Helpdesk and Knowledge Books.

#### **GradeBook**


A new page has been added into the teacher's GradeBook called Assignment Maintenance. It is available on the teacher's homepage and Dashboard. This page will allow teachers to:

- \* Filter the list of assignments by selecting the assignment type they want to view
- \* Delete unwanted assignments
- \* Change selections for posting marks to the web and/or posting the assignment to the homework planner

#### **ParentAccess**

Did you know that staff members with the roles of Clerk, Principal and School Support can now reset Parent and Students passwords? This feature must be turned on by your GradeBook Administrator and can be turned on/off for each school in your district.



#### VirtualClassroom

We have several districts using VirtualClassroom. Please keep in mind that VirtualClassroom is still in Beta until January, so right now, it is free to use. If you are a district that has not signed up to use it, you can feel free to try it out until January. After January, there will be a charge.

#### **Special Services (SpS)**

**SpS Has a few New Features** – You can now add a Watermark to the pages!!! Simply check the add watermark checkmark at the top of the page and uncheck it when you have your final copy. You now also have the option to include page numbers by checking or unchecking the box at the top of each form as well.



Reminder: When Software-Answers, the developers, are officially notified by ODE of changes, they will be applied to the forms. They do communicate on a regular basis, but until the changes are official, they are not written into the software.

# EMIS UPDATE

- The new ODDEX system is up and running! At this time the SOES and cross check parts of the system are not running but should be soon.
- FY14 Graduate report period is scheduled to close on November 14<sup>th</sup>.
- Student Cross Reference system districts should be verifying collection on at least a weekly basis.
- The new report period 'S' will be opening soon. This report period will be broken down into three reporting windows. Each reporting window will include transactions from July 1 through the end of the reporting window. Reporting is on-going meaning there is no cut-off date. As students are enrolled in your district, their data will be included in the next transfer regardless of enrollment date. The first window will include the following records:
  - GI, GJ, FS, FD (excluding FD 120, 140, 160, 180, 190, 200), FN070, FN270, GE, FE, FC, FL, DN (select attributes by period), and GQ (limited codes)

# **Update on Requisition Approval Manager (RAM)**

The RAM system is a third party vendor module for requisition approval online. Currently there are 3 districts using it and it is working well. We will be bringing on 2 new districts this fall.

The fee is annual so your startup year would be pro-rated from the month you have us start to set up your configuration, staff and work flows, through the end of June. You will then be billed in full on July 1<sup>st</sup> for the upcoming year.

## **New Fiscal Open Labs**

In October we started providing fiscal open labs. These labs will assist users with Payroll, Budgetary, EIS, and Kiosk topics that they experience trouble with throughout the year, or those 'once a year' type of processes. Labs are being offered regionally so more people have the opportunity to attend.

These are not for new users. These are for a user, with some experience, where one on one assistance would be of great benefit. Users must send subject matter they wish to have covered in detail, that they normally have problems with, one week before the open lab in order for the instructor to prepare and ensure they get the most out of their time spent in the lab.

# **New User Trainings**

We have completed scheduling new user trainings for the fall. New payroll trainings are scheduled for October 10<sup>th</sup> and October 22<sup>nd</sup>; New budgetary on October 8<sup>th</sup>. # **New EMIS Reporting Periods**

ODE has changed the EMIS reporting periods, **S** for student and **L** for staff/staff course master data. It is very important to keep up with the staff changes in your district as they occur. Since your district has the option to report staff information weekly, you will need to update your job screens with correct position start dates and changing the report to EMIS flag to Y or N when employee's positions change. You want to give ODE the most current information so your funding is current.



# Outbox Spam (3015) Trash

#### **Best Practices to Combat Spam:**

- •Never make a purchase from an unsolicited email. If spamming weren't economically viable, it would be obsolete. Not only can an email user fall prey to a potentially fraudulent sales scheme, but his or her email address can also be added to the numerous email lists that are sold within the spamming community, further compounding the number of junk emails received.
- •If you do not know the sender of an unsolicited email message, delete it. While most spam is usually just annoying text, a spam email message could actually contain a virus and/or other exploit that could damage the computers of all who open it.
- Never respond to any spam messages or click on any links in the message. Replying to any spam message, even to "unsubscribe" or be "removed" from the email list only confirms to the spammer that you are a valid recipient and a perfect target for future spamming.
- •Avoid using the preview functionality of your email client software. Many spammers use advertising techniques that can track when a message is viewed, even if you don't click on the message or reply. Using the preview functionality essentially opens an email and tells spammers you are a valid recipient, which can result in even more spam.
- •When sending email messages to a large number of recipients, use the blind copy (BCC) field to conceal their email addresses. Sending email where all recipient addresses are "exposed" in the "To" field makes it vulnerable to harvesting by a spammer's traps.
- •Think carefully before you provide your email address on websites, newsgroup lists or other online public forum. Many spammers utilize "web bots" that automatically surf the Internet to harvest email addresses from public information and forums.
- Never give your primary email address to anyone or any site you don't trust. Share it only with your close friends and business colleagues.

# TECHNICAL SERVICES UPDATE-(CONTINUED)

• Have and use one or two secondary email addresses. If you need to fill out web registration forms, or surveys at sites from which you don't want to receive further information, consider using secondary addresses to protect primary email accounts from spam abuse. Also, always look for a box that solicits future information/offers, and be sure to select or deselect as appropriate.
